

IDAHO COUNCIL ON DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND VICTIM ASSISTANCE

Policy for Temporary Remote Supervision

The Idaho Council on Domestic Violence and Victim Assistance shall be the advisory body for programs and services affecting victims of domestic violence and other crimes in Idaho (Pursuant to Idaho Code Title 39-5201).

As such, the council has established the following protocol for temporary remote supervision of a domestic violence offender intervention program seeking to qualify program supervisors and direct service providers:

- Supervision must comply with all other standards set in the minimum standards of offender intervention set forth by the Idaho Council on Domestic Violence and Victim Assistance.
- Initial supervision session must be conducted onsite.
- Supervisor must review treatment records and documentation.
- Supervisor must periodically conduct on-site review for program compliance.
- The Supervisor must follow up with the provider to provide feedback and mentoring following supervision sessions.
- Video Equipment will provide quality sound and picture so that the supervisor can see and hear the group and facilitator.
- The software of the telecommunications shall meet or exceed applicable federal and state legal requirements of medical/health information privacy, including compliance with the health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) and state privacy, confidentiality, security and medical retention rules.
- Before engaging in a telecommunication program, the approved Domestic Violence Intervention provider shall seek and obtain approval for such program from the Idaho Council on Domestic Violence and Victim Assistance.
