

General Resource Information

Resources available in Idaho for information related to domestic violence, sexual assault, and places of safety and shelter are included on this handout. Shelters provide food, shelter, clothing, and referral services in a supportive atmosphere. In some areas of Idaho, motels provide emergency housing and those with longer shelter needs are referred to nearby shelters. Emergency medical help is available from your local doctor, hospital, or clinic. Many areas now offer specially trained Sexual Assault Nurse or Forensic Examiners (SANE or SAFE nurses).

Civil Protection Orders

In a domestic violence situation, you may seek a civil protection order. You can contact any of the Idaho programs and ask for assistance and information about protection orders. There are advocates who can help you, and there is no charge for assistance.

A Civil Protection Order Can:

- Stop the person from harming you and/or your children
- Stop the person who has been hurting you from entering your home, school, or where you work
- Require the person who hurt you to get help with counseling
- Require the abuser to leave the household
- Keep your children in your care

Criminal No-Contact Orders

If someone has hurt you and is arrested, he or she may be issued a Criminal No-Contact Order as a condition of their release from jail. This can order the abuser to stay away from you, your home, your workplace, or your school and stop contacting you. You can call any Idaho programs listed in this brochure and ask for information about Criminal No-Contact Orders. There are advocates who can help you, and there is no charge for assistance.

Victim Compensation

The Idaho CVCP assists victims of crime with costs related to treatment for injuries sustained because of a crime and for Sexual Assault Forensic Examinations. The program works with victims and family members to ensure eligible victims are provided appropriate financial assistance to aid in recovery from the traumatic effects of crime.
