
DOMESTIC VIOLENCE COURT TRAINING SERIES PRESENTS:

Ada County Domestic Violence Court invites you to a presentation by Boise Police Domestic Violence Detective Corporal Sherri Cameron. During this Lunch & Learn, attendees will be provided with a better understanding of the Idaho Risk Assessment of Dangerousness (IRAD). This evidence-based lethality instrument was designed with a focus toward Idaho's variables. The tool is most efficient and effective when used at each stage through the justice system. This training will allow participants to walk away with a working knowledge of IRAD to incorporate this tool into his/her work with domestic violence.

Sherri Coronado (Cameron) has been an Idaho law enforcement officer for over 22 years. During her career, she worked as a patrol officer, a Crime Scene Investigator, Field Training Officer, Defensive Tactics Instructor, and Domestic Violence Detective. Sherri developed and conducted training in the areas of Radio Procedures, Crime Scene Investigation, Domestic Violence, Autism and Developmental Disabilities. She provides domestic violence training to law enforcement and the community. Sherri was selected as the Domestic Violence Detective and has served in that role for over 8 years.

Sherri is actively working both within the department and outside partners (Prosecutors, Judges, Probation/Parole, Family Justice Center(s), Women's & Children's Alliance, and the Idaho Coalition) in an effort to continue to educate others on domestic violence, improve processes for victims, and train first responders to assist them in making decisions with as much knowledge as possible. Sherri provides domestic violence training to law enforcement recruits, veteran officers, and the community to help educate and teach aspects specific to domestic violence. She partners with City and County Prosecutors to ensure solid investigations and cases are conducted.

In order to maintain current knowledge on domestic violence topics, Sherri has attended: Idaho Victim Assistance Academy (basic & advanced), Strangulation Training (basic level; train-the-trainer, and advanced courses), Domestic Violence (PATC), Neurobiology of Trauma, Elder Abuse, Forensic Experiential Trauma Interview, Stalking Investigations & Technology, and Mental Health Training. She has taken her training and on-the-job skills and developed training courses for Domestic Violence (basic level intro), Predominant Aggressor(s), Stalking, and Strangulation. Her trainings have been delivered to County Paramedics, County Fire Departments, Prosecutors, Judges, Defense Attorneys, Therapists, Treatment Providers, State Corrections, Probation & Parole, Domestic Violence Evaluators, Nurses, Victim Witness and Victim Advocates, Dispatch, and Law Enforcement Agencies across Idaho and Wyoming.

Sherri has been part of multi-disciplinary teams, domestic panels, and conferences to include being a key note speaker in several events. She is a recognized expert on Domestic Violence, Stalking & Strangulation in the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> Judicial Court Districts in Idaho, has testified on Stalking to the Idaho Legislature, and has testified as an expert in a civil domestic situation to the Idaho Peace Officers Standards & Training (POST). Sherri has a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice from Boise State University and holds a Master certificate from Idaho POST. She is a certified State instructor in multiple disciplines.

Sherri is the owner of Double C Consulting, which takes her all over the nation teaching professionals on Domestic Violence, including: strangulation stalking, predominant aggressor, Autism, and Developmental Disabilities to disciplines in both the justice system and the community. She has written the curriculum and lesson plan for both Domestic Violence and Developmental Disabilities for Idaho Peace Officers Standards & Training for Law Enforcement.
